

COURSE NUMBER: 2104A & 2104B
COURSE TITLE: Basic United States History
COURSE LENGTH: Year, Two Credits
PREREQUISITE: None
GRADE LEVEL: 9-12

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course begins with the Native Americans and proceeds through 1992. It will focus on the most important events in American History, when and why they happened. It is an open entry class meaning students can enter the class at any semester and learn about the periods currently being studied.

COURSE RATIONALE:

This course is designed to be a substituted American Heritage course (History portion).

METHOD OF INSTRUCTION:

This course will include class discussions, group, paired, or independent reading activities, worksheets, study guides, videotapes, outside projects, reading and study of U.S. History text.

ASSESSMENT:

Class participation, daily assignments, worksheets, quizzes, tests, class discussion, and projects.

CRITICAL OBJECTIVES:

1. To be able to name important events from U.S. History.
2. To understand how the United States came to become a nation.
3. To gain a better understanding of our American Heritage.
